1846-Terr. Family head; no. of males and females in racial categories. Lacks Chippewa, Crawford, Fond-du-Lac, LaPoint, Portage (Grand Rapids only), Richland, Sheboygan, Washington and Waukesha Counties. Not indexed.

1847-Terr. Family head; no of males and females in racial categories. Lacks Chippewa, Rock, Sheboygan, Washington, and Waukesha Counties. Not indexed.

1855-State. Family head; no. of males and females in racial categories; foreign born. Lacks Kewaunee Co. Not indexed.

1865-State. Family head; no. of males and females in racial categories; foreign born. Destroyed except for Dunn, Green, Jackson, Kewaunee, Ozaukee and Sheboygan Counties. Not indexed.

1875-State. Family head; no. of males and females in racial categories. Not indexed.

1885-State. Family head; no. of males and females in racial categories; county of birth.

Special enumeration for soldiers and sailors of the Civil War-- name, rank, company and regiment, state served, current address. Not indexed.

1895-State. Same as above.

1905-State. Name of each person; age; sex; race; relationship to head of household; marital status; occupation; place of birth; parents place of birth; owned or rented home or farm.

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### PROBATE RECORDS

No Will? Perhaps you need to ask for the probate package [or packet] instead. In that you might find letters of administration, guardianships and estate inventory. These documents may contain valuable information if you read them carefully.

They should include names of the people who prepared them and their relation to the deceased, many times the location and the date. It may give the date of death and place of residence at the time of death. Sometimes these packets list persons who owed the deceased money. If the money was owed by children, it was usually listed and deducted from their share of the estate.

## CENSUS RECORDS

The Personal Census Service Branch, Bureau of the Census, Pittsburg, Kansas, searches census records for age and citizenship information. Under federal law, all expenses incurred in providing census transcripts are covered by fees paid by individuals who require personal information from the decennial census records. In order to provide this service, the branch had been operating with a fee structure of \$15 for a search. Due to increased operating costs, effective 1 October 1989, the fee for this service was increased to \$25. Additional copies, if desired, are \$2 each. Full schedules for genealogical purposes are furnished upon request at an additional charge of \$6 each. ## COMPUTER BACKUP

The computer backup of genealogical data is important. One method is to use two backup disks and one working disk. Here's how it works. Number the backup disks 1 and 2 (or A and B). First, copy the contents of disk 1 to disk 2. Second, copy the contents of the working disk to disk 1. This way disk 1 is always the most recent backup. If disk 1 should become corrupted for whatever reason, you can then use disk 2 to recover your data. Use the fastest disk copying program you can find.

Keep a separate set of your data disks at an entirely different location. You may have your brother or sister, etc. keep them for you. Just think what a fire in your home, heaven forbid, would do to all that carefully collected data. Imagine having to put all those hours in to duplicate that information.

How often should you backup your disks? Not to beg the question, but how much is your time worth? At the end of each session, you should back up each disk used. So quit early enough to leave time. If the session runs beyond a specific period of time, say one hour or two hours, then you should backup your data every one hour or every two hours. Write the time down to remind yourself.

### MASSACHUSETTS CUSTOMS RECORDS

The National Archives-New England Region has accessioned 900 feet of Customs Service records. These records date from 1789 to 1915 and document much of New England's rich history including clipper trade with China, the whaling industry and all forms of ocean going commerce. In 1932 these records were deposited with the Essex Institute in Salem, Massachusetts, since there was no national Archives at the time. Under the guidance of National Archives-New England Region Director James K. 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## THE DOS AND DON'TS OF QUERY WRITING

1. Don't use abbreviations. The Query Editor will prepare your query for publication.
2. Don't try to cram too much material in one query. It confuses people!
3. Do limit your query to one family. It is better to prepare several queries and get results than to submit just one and hear from no one.
4. Do mention specific persons, time spans and geographic locations. Listing names and states does not produce results especially when it is a common surname. (i. e. "all the Smiths in Illinois").
5. Do be specific in what you want to know.
6. Don't clutter your query with your relationship to the persons mentioned unless it is pertinent. Once you have established contact, this information can be exchanged.
7. Do include the year, country and state when citing a census.
8. Do limit your query to persons and events in the area of the publication. It may be helpful to mention the previous residence, but there is no need to explain the migration route.
9. Do type or print your query; just because you have been able to read your handwriting for the past 40 years doesn't mean everyone can.
10. Do read your query after you have written it. Does it really say what you meant?
11. Do remember: WHO, WHAT and WHERE produces results!
12. Do submit your query. Your query may not get a reply. If you don't submit your query, it definitely won't get a reply.
