

Colonial 1101 W. 5th Street

The Colonial style, refers to a rectangular, symmetrical home with bedrooms on the second floor. The double-hung windows usually have many small, equally sized square panes. During the late 1800s and throughout the 20th century, builders borrowed Colonial ideas to create refined Colonial Revival homes with elegant central hall-



ways and elaborate cornices. Unlike the original Colonials, Colonial Revival homes are often sided in white clapboard and trim-med with black or green louvered shutters. This home features simple cornices below the roof, and a large balconied entry portico, with double pillars and sidelights at the door.

The home is historically known as the Robert & Katherine Beggs House and was built in 1947.
