L. A. Wright, Bakery & Ice Cream Parlors, a.k.a. The City Bakery

There is no country in the world where so much pie and cake is consumed as in the United States, consequently the business of a professional baker assumes a position not accorded it in other countries. The lead-

ing bakery in the city is conducted by L. A. Wright. *The business was* established by Mr. Wright fourteen years ago, and he has built up a large trade and an extensive reputation for the *superior quality* of his baked goods. He carries in stock a good assortment of bread, cakes. pies, cookies, etc., absolutely pure and baked fresh daily, which he sells at wholesale and retail. He

keeps in his employ two expert bakers. A line of fancy groceries, canned and bottled goods, all the seasonable fruits, confections, etc., are also carried. Lunches are also served at all hours of the day, and in the rear of the store is a parlor where ice cream of Mr. Wright's own manufacture is served. A specialty is made of furnishing banquets, weddings, parties, receptions and public gatherings with pastry on short notice. They are enterprising people and that their goods are appreciated by the public is evidenced by the splendid business done. (The Marshfield Times, July 25, 1902)

Marshfield has the distinction of one large bakery which is successfully managed by a woman. This is the attractive establishment of Mrs. L. A. Wright. The store which is familiar to citizens as "The City Bakery," carries a fine stock of fancy and staple groceries. Some idea of the extent of the business is gained from the fact that two delivery wagons are necessary to supply customers. The place has catered to the local public about 16 years and the growth of the business has been almost constant, a fact which bespeaks the popularity and business judgment of the proprietress. The City Bakery, owned and conducted by Mr. and Mrs. L. A. Wright was the first institution of the kind in Marshfield and has been doing business here for nineteen years. A line of staple and fancy groceries is carried in connection, with all kinds of fruit in season. The product of the bakery is first-class in every respect and its pies, cakes, doughnuts, bread etc., are justly popular in the homes of Marshfield. A practical bakery is employed and Mrs. Wright devotes her time to the store. (Marshfield Times, August 26,
