They also have an informative helpful book entitled "Guide to Irish Genealogy".

MAJOR CIVIL WAR RECORDS
IN PRINT

Two major sets of books relating to the Civil War have been published by Broadfoot Publishing Company of Wilmington, N.C. The publishing firm specializes in bibliographies, sources and reprints in Confederate and Southern history.

The Confederate Veteran has been released in 40 volumes covering a 40 year period.

Accompanying these books is *Confederate Veteran Index* of 2,700 pages in three volumes. The cumulative index lists every name mentioned in 20,000 pages of the *Veteran* as well as all historical material. There are 456,000 entries in all.

The second important reprint is *The Official Records of the Union and Confederate Armies*, in 128 volumes. There are about 281,000 entries in the index.

SENIORS, JUNIORS NOT ALWAYS RELATED

Researchers who trace back far and often enough in American genealogy eventually learn that Sr, Jr, 3rd, etc. were used in earlier times to rank by age contemporaries of the same name within a community.

For example, the name John Jones Jr indicated that living within the same town was an older man and of the same name, who would be styled John Jones Sr. The important point to be remembered is that John Sr might have been John Jones Jr's father, grandfather, uncle, older cousin or no relation at all. Further, if there were three persons named John Jones, there would be a John Jones 3rd (the youngest). If the eldest died or moved away, the remaining two would "move up": John Jr would become John Sr and John 3rd would become John Jr.

Although these designations were more often applied to men, they were sometimes used for women. An example, found in the published vital records of Pembroke, Massachusetts, is the marriage of Rebecca Keen 3rd to Charles Josselyn in 1760. Evidently there were two other Rebecca Keens living in the area at this time; these were identified as Rebecca, the wife of Joseph Keen, and Rebecca, the wife of Snow Keen.

Since Rebecca (Keen) Josselyn was the daughter of neither of these older Rebeccas, it is clear that the three Rebeccas were not related. Also, after the youngest Rebecca married Charles Josselyn, and was no longer called Rebecca Keen, she ceased to be styled as Rebecca 3rd. --from *The American Genealogist*, Jan 1984, by Roger Joslyn FASG.

HERALDIC INFORMATION IN SWEDEN

In Sweden, the traditions of heraldry are governed by an official board called the Riddarhusdirektionen (the Directorate of the House of Nobility). This group approves coats of arms for flags, towns and individuals.

MASSACHUSETTS MILITARY RECORDS

Military records held by the Adjutant General's Office, War Records, Room 1000, 100 Cambridge St., Boston, MA 02202 are for the following periods:

War of 1812-14: 1 Volume--Records of the Massachusetts Militia--Called out by the Governor of Massachusetts to Suppress a Threatened Invasion During the War of 1812-14 (does not contain vital statistics); no record of those that served in regular U.S. Military Service.

Indian Wars: no records.

Mexican War (1846-48): only record is of the 1st Regiment, Massachusetts Infantry that was called to duty (no vital statistics); no record of those that served in regular U.S. Military Service.--from the *Genealogy Week Section of Antique Week Newspaper*
