#### FINNISH PASSPORT APPLICATIONS

Passport applications for the years 1850 through 1920 are now available at the ... Library in Salt Lake City. The Oulu City Office covered virtually all applications from all of Oulu and Lappi Counties. Vassa County had the main office in Vaasa City, plus seven or eight other local offices. # WOOD COUNTY TAX RECORDS FROM 1900 - 1950 LOCATED

When Emil Krause gave his presentation on the Court House, he said that no one seemed to know where the tax records of 1900 -1950 were located. He has since found the answer. These tax records are in a storage room at the Court House. They will be picked up by the Wisconsin State Historical Society and ultimately deposited at the Area Research Center in Stevens Point. Only the records from every 5th year were retained - the rest were destroyed in 1985. So, eventually these records will be available for research in Stevens Point.

Wood County Register of Deeds office has had to review its guidelines for geneology to comply with the State of Wisconsin rules for Vital Statistics. These guidelines are necessary in order for us to preserve the records and still allow you access to the vital records of our office.

Office personnel will show you where the indexes and record books are kept.

You may NOT look in the following volumes:

Births: Volumes 1, 2, 3, 4,

without staff assistance:

Volumes 159 to present

Marriages: Volume 43 to present

Veteran Service Records are NOT available to the public.

Please treat the books with respect. Use only pencil in vital records area. Only 1 (one) book is allowed out of the rack at a time and must remain in the vital record area. Do not lay anything on the open book. Lift the pages of the books carefully, do not snap.

Please limit the size of your group to 2 and keep your conversation to a minimum and in soft tones. Others working in the office require a high degree of concentration and loud conversation is distracting.

The vital statistic law in Wisconin went into effect June 1, 1907, therefore the records before that time are incomplete. Please realize that these records are transcribed from the originals, which are in Madison and some handwriting is not easy to read. Also we are not allowed to make any corrections on very old records.

If you require copies of any of the records, they will be made for you at the fee prescribed for certified copies. The charge for a certified copy of a birth record is \$8.00 and death or marriage record is \$5.00. We will not make uncertified copies of these records.

Please hang your coats on the coat rack in the outer office.

To assist you with your search we are providing the following space for those records which will require staff assistance.
