GENE-A-RAMA '90 by Denise Jacobs

Gene-A-Rama is over for another year. For a newcomer like myself, the excitement of meeting all those other researchers in person will carry me through a long, lonely winter of researching at my typewriter!

Sponsored by the Wisconsin Genealogical Council, this year's Gene-A-Rama was held 22-23 June at the Holiday Inn in Wisconsin Dells. Approximately 100 people from throughout the state attended.

Lectures were offered on cemetery research, beginning genealogy, the Wisconsin Archives Network, Newsletter editing and query writing. Our own Lou Hacker was a panelist for query writing. Jim Schlosser, who headed the panel on newsletter editing, asked Lou if he could have a copies of *Kith and Kin* to display at the panel. He told Lou that the Marshfield newsletter was one of the better ones in the state.

The packet given to each participant at registration is a gold mine of information. Particularly helpful is the Gene-A-Rama handbook which contains: a summary of all the lectures, a handbook for the operation of genealogical societies, and a surname list of the participants.

Throughout the Holidome were exhibitors representing local or ethnic genealogy groups. Did you know that there is a Polish Genealogical Society of Wisconsin? There were vendors selling everything from computer software to gravestone rubbing material.

Lou Hacker set up the display table for MAGG featuring some of our library holdings, and handouts that disappeared rapidly. Even though I didn't

answer as many questions as Lou did, I was fascinated by personal reminiscences of people who once lived in the Marshfield area.

The 1991 Gene-A-Rama will be 14-15 June 1991 at the Eau Claire Civic Center. Just being in the same room with so many researchers and so much information was exhilarating. If you've gotten bogged down in your "diggings", Gene-A-Rama may be just the booster you need to get you going again. I know it worked for me!

DO YOU WANT A CERTIFICATE OR A RECORD?

Do you understand the difference between a certificate and a record? The certificate is simply a formal paper to testify to the date, cause and place of death, birth or marriage. The death record for the same instance, includes somewhat more information. In a similar vein, if you ask for a a marriage register, and not a certificate, you get more information. The marriage register gives the parents names, places of residence of the bride and groom, often their birth places, age, where they were married, by whom, the names of witnesses, etc.--from *ILL-IA-MO Searcher*, via *The Illuminator*, (Zion Genealogical Society, Zion, Illinois), 6, No. 2, (1990) p.8.

EXECUTOR OF A WILL

Did you know that if there is a will, it is probated by an "Executor". If the probate is by an "Administrator", it means that there was no will. The Administrator is appointed by the court in such cases.

Land records should always be searched after a death. Often a drawing of the divided estate will be found, plus a list of heirs. Remember land was our ancestor's most treasured possession. **TAKING A GOOD PICTURE OF
AN OLD GRAVESTONE**

While you are on vacation and making a stop at a cemetery where your ancestor is buried you want to be sure you get the best picture you can. Bring along: a stiff bristled brush (never wire), a stick of soft white chalk (either carpenter's or railroad chalk), and your camera with film.

- 1) Brush the gravestone to clean the surface.
- 2) Rub the old stone with the chalk in vertical strokes (not crosswise or you will fill up the letters). Try to cover the complete area where the lettering appears.
- 3) Take several pictures from different angles.

Even if the gravestone is very old and quite unreadable to the naked eye, many times the writing will show up, on the developed picture. This works with either black and white or colored film.--from *Gems of Genealogy*, (*Bay Area Genealogical Society, Inc., Green Bay, Wisconsin*), XVI (May-June 1990), p. 1.
