Remember: 500 word limit per story, one picture per story. You may submit more than one story in the book (for example - one story on your grandparents, one on your parents and one on your family, etc.) We are however, limiting the submittions to stories of families that lived in or near Marshfield not only from the earlier years, but also up to and including now.
