David E. Rencher, A. G., FUGA is employed by the Family History Department in Salt Lake City where he is the Family History Outreach Coordinator for North America, Europe and the Pacific. A professional genealogist since 1977, he was accredited in Ireland research in 1981. He graduated from Brigham Young University in 1980 with a B. A. in Family and Local History.

He has served as a reference consultant for the British Isles in the Family History Library, as supervisor of the Family History Center Operations Unit and as the manager for developing authority systems and resource files for FamilySearch®. As a professional genealogist, he lived in the British Isles and conducted contract work for other professional genealogists. He has traveled extensively throughout England, Wales and Ireland and regularly travels there for genealogical research. He has conducted genealogical research tours to Ireland for *In Search of Ancestors* from 1992 to 1993. In 1997 he is conducting a research tour to England and Ireland for the *Institute of Genealogy and Historical Research*.

He is currently President of the Federation of Genealogical Societies and previously served on the board of directors and as treasurer. He has served in various capacities on the boards of several organizations receiving numerous awards for his work on behalf of genealogical organizations.

He served as the National Conference Chairman for the FGS conferences in Seattle, Washington and Rochester, New York. He is immediate past-president of the Utah Genealogical Association and is a Fellow of that organization.

The Monroe, Juneau, Jackson County's Genealogy Workshop's annual workshop will be held Saturday, 5 April 1997 at Holiday Inn, I-94 Exit 143 East on Hwy 21, at Tomah, WI.

GUESTSPEAKER, Michael R. Haase, has been involved in genealogy research since age five with a broad base in U.S. Canada, Scotland, England, Ireland and Germany. He is immediate past president of the Germanic Genealogy Society located in St. Paul, MN. He developed the format for the society's newsletter and is currently co-editor and contributor. He was a co-editor of *Germanic Genealogy: A Guide to Worldwide Sources*. Born in Fairbault County, MN living on a farm purchased by his greatgreatgrandfather, Wilhelm Haase, who arrived in New York in 1854 from Patzig, Neumark, Brandenburg. Prior to arriving in MN in 1861 the family lived near Germania, Shields Township, Green Lake County, (Now Marquette County) WI. He is a Sergeant with the Airport Police Dept at Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport. He is married to Janet Lee Haase, herself a genealogist for 23 years and owner of Genealogy House.

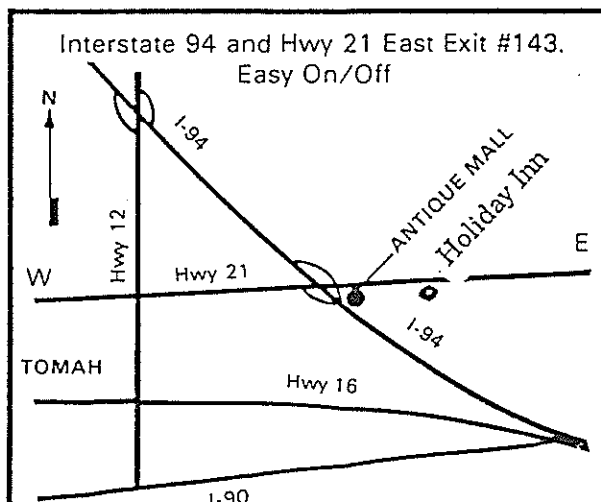

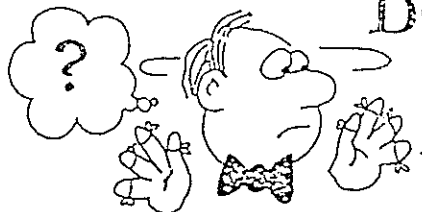

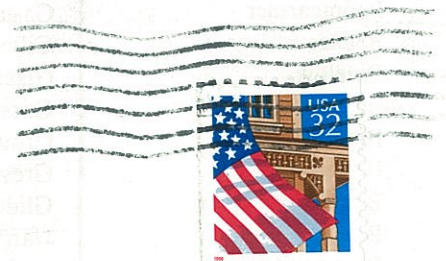
