



1801 CENSUS OF NORWAY ON THE INTERNET

One of the most useful web sites for Norwegian research is the Norwegian census of 1801. Placed on the web by the Department of History at the University of Bergen, the 1801 page provides the original census lists with data organized by county, parish, district and farms. The census provides information on everyone living in Norway on February 1, 1801, with the exception of two parishes, Holt and Dypvaag. GERMAN DISTRICT RECORDS

If moving out of a district, one was required to report this information to the local priest, within 5 days, and relay their new address. Missing town persons were "hunted down." If you wished to leave Germany it was necessary to report this fact to the Hamburg police and the local clergy. The Hamburg police issued the permits to board a ship. The permit noted if the emigrant was debt-free and wasn't leaving an abandoned wife behind. Some sailed from Antwerp, Belgium; and the local hotel records are available where the emigrants stayed prior to boarding ships. These hotel registers were turned over to the priests. Also, the Bavarian Archives houses "Guild Records" (i.e., USA labor unions.) The data contained there in are the work records and schedules of the apprentices.

A good source of information for the family historian searching for deceased veterans is the Central Office, VA Affairs Office, 310 Vermont Ave., NW, Washington, DC 20422. If your ancestor's grave is marked with a military marker, it must have been formally requested through official channels. The request forms may give the relative's names and addresses as well as other information. To obtain a copy of the request, send all known information plus your relationship to the deceased to the above address.

SANBORN FIRE INSURANCE MAPS

Many people who are researching their American ancestry have found the Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps very helpful, but they do not provide information for information about commercial districts in cities. Usually residential areas were included only if they were one to three blocks from the business districts. Getting help from these maps depends upon the following: Did your ancestor have a store or a company of some kind? Did he live in the city's downtown area? If so, the maps reveal a lot about him. They can pinpoint his place of business or residence almost like a modern aerial map. They will show the exact shape and relative size of the building. They will describe its type of construction: brick, stone, concrete, or wood. Sheds, garages, wells, and number of rooms will be shown. The map will reveal the neighbors and other businesses.

The maps were frequently updated. If your ancestor's home is on the maps, you can learn when the house was built and how it changed through the years, revealing when rooms were added and porches built on. The maps were issued during the years 1882 and 1970. They were usually reissued at least once every five years. These maps can be seen at the State Historical Society at Madison, WI and most of its branches.

THE IRS AS A LOCATOR? IT'S TRUE!

When we think of the IRS, we automatically think of the Internal Revenue Service - federal and state income taxes, our responsibility in meeting the terms and deadlines for reporting our earnings, and then sending in our payment to the correct government office. Are you aware that same Internal Revenue Service, through its Disclosure Office, could assist you in locating someone? The District's Disclosure Office can give you assistance per IRM 1272 (11) (14), the Internal Revenue Service's policy that allows its personnel to forward certain letters for "humane purposes."

Two examples of this type of service are: 1) a person seeking to find a missing person to convey a message of an urgent nature such as a serious illness, eminent death or the death of a close relative, or 2) a person seeking to find a missing relative.

If your research trail includes a missing relative, and you have tried every idea you can think in locating your relative, consider using the IRS Disclosure Office. The IRS will provide the date of the last return of an individual, which includes the address to which the return was sent. You will need the subject's full name and Social Security Number. We do have the privilege of using the Freedom of Information Act to aid us in opening records of importance to us. Write for the forms: Internal Revenue Service, Disclosure Room 5202, 300 North Los Angeles Street, CA 90012.

FIRE WARNING FOR ALL GENEALOGISTS!!!

There is a potential firebomb in your house! Fire marshals across the country have already been alerted that between 1889 and the mid 1950's all film contained nitric acid. This means ALL FILM -negatives, slides, home movies. With age, this film will self-combust, especially in attics and basements.

This is a very real danger, but there are some things you can do. You can have each piece of film tested - or test yourself using a special pen from an archival products company. Your best with old film is to have new copies made on modern film. The old film should be destroyed - very carefully because nitric acid fumes are toxic.
