KITH AND KIN INDEXING PROJECT

You have already probably noticed that in your last 2 issues of *Kith and Kin*, the start of a new article, actually an index. The editor of *Kith and Kin* is currently indexing past issues of the newsletter. The first reason is to help better serve you, the members and readers of *Kith and Kin*, in an attempt to prevent duplication of articles, and second to aid you in your research in finding past articles that have appeared in *Kith and Kin*.

NATURALIZATION INDEXING PROJECT NEEDS YOUR HELP

The Wood County naturalization project volunteers need your help to find the first sixteen years of citizenship documents which are missing. Wood County was formed in 1856 from Portage county, yet the earliest citizenship records found at the Wood County clerk of Courts begin in 1872. Portage County's naturalization records do not contian Wood County naturalization document after 1856, the Clerk of Courts does not know where the earliest records are, and the South Wood County Historical Society does not have them. The Immigration and Naturalization Service and Chicago Branch of the National Archives have been contacted and no early Wood county documents have been found. Sometimes early newpapers published the names of persons applying for citizenship, and this is how you can help. When your are reading the pre-1872 Wood County newspapers, please make note of any citiizenship applicants and contact a naturalization project committee member with what you have found. We would like the finished index to be as complete as possible and thank you for your help. Send information to the Heart O'Wisconsin Gen. COLORADO RESEARCH NEWS

AVERAGES CAN HELP

If your research in the pioneering period (before 1850) had "dead-ended," it is time for creative thinking. You may find these trends helpful in analyzing your problems.

- 1) There are approximately 3 generations per century.
- 2) Average age for men to marry was 24. They rarely married before 20.
- 3) The average age for women to marry was 20. They rarely married before 16.
- 4) First marriages were usually between couples near the same age. Women generally outlived their husbands, but old widowers frequently married much younger women who had never been married before. (Remember those old Revolutionary War soldiers!)
- 5) Births generally occurred at two-year intervals. Frequently the first child was born a year after marriage. As a woman aged, the interval between births increased slightly. Child bearing generally ended at about 45.
- 6) Families and neighbors generally migrated together from their old homes. Women rarely traveled alone.
- 7) Men usually married women from their neighborhood. If a seemingly "strange" woman turned up, check the man's former home. Often men returned to their former residence to find a wife.
- 8) If you can't find an old parent, chances are he or she "went west" with a son.
- 9) If you have an ancestor born around 1840, strongly consider the possibility of Civil War military service.

- 10) Studies show that after 1850 Ohio pioneers frequently moved to counties in other states on the same latitude as their home county in Ohio.
- 11) If your ancestor had a "virtue name" (e.g., Patience, Silence, etc.) consider New England heritage.
- 12) Children were often named for the grandparents, both male and female.
- 13) Frequently a middle name or even a first name was the mother's or grandmother's, especially if the name is repeated through several related families.

GERMAN RESEARCH

In Germany, men had to complete military training before receiving permission to emigrate. Because of this many families left Europe with out official Some of these undocumented permission. emigrants can now be identified. A database of persons who were not found when the government tried to contact them is being compiled. The Germanic Emigrants Register will eventually cover the years from 1820-1918 and include 800,000 entries. The immigrant Genealogical Society, P.O. Box 7369, Burbank, CA 91510-7369 has the mircofiche index to the first 277,000 entries covering the years 1895-1918. Volunteers will check this list for you and provide a translation of the information in the index plus a form and instructions for submitting a search of the database in Germany.

FAMILY EXPOSURE ON THE INTERNET

A word of caution is necessary about invading the provacy of your living relatives by sharing genealogical data concerning them without written permission. You may guilty without realizing it, if you pass along genealogical databases or research notes to a third party, any time, particularly on the internet. The living have a right to provacy. Web pages may have personal information about you, your children and living relatives where any kook or crook can find it. Our generous nature of sharing genealogical data via GEDCOM, pedigree charts or family group sheets with others may end up on web Our caring and sharing nature makes us vulnerable. They ask—we send—handing over all of our genealogical notes to cousins, some distant, some strangers. We need to think about the results of these actions. If you find information about you or your living relatives on the internet, request the posted information be removed. Be adamant. DO NOT list others' genealogical data on your web site without expressed written permission. All living persons' dates should be excluded. Do not stop sharing your ancestral information, but also remember to protect the rights of the living-and your own family.
