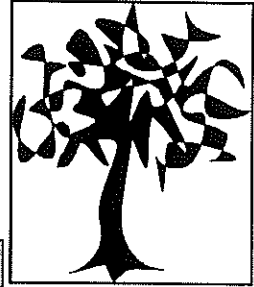

MESSAGE IN A BOTTLE

An Eagle Rock Mo. researcher found a way to communicate with unknown family members by making contacts in cemeteries. She left basic genealogical information in a small jar at her ancestors' grave sites, including her name and address. She has been surprised to receive responses as much as three years later, from previously unknown cousins who visited the cemetery. Now she has discovered another possibility that may have a much longer date-preservation implications. Her parents are buried in a cemetery which allows only bronze plates flush with the ground to be installed. Many of these have an attached vase that is raised for use and inverted and stored under the marker when not in use. She found there is a nice space underneath in which a jar can be placed containing family information. She got this idea from reading a story of an old house that was being torn down. GENEALOGICAL REFERENCE BOOK FOR LIBRARIANS

There is a new (published August 1998 by the American Librarian Association) reference work by Dahrl E. Moore title "Librarian's Genealogy Notebook: A Guide to Resources." This book includes a brief guide to genealogy; library reference service; a checklist of genealogical sources and abbreviations; a bit on census records and forms; vital, passenger, land and will and probate records; general books most libraries should own; a basic genealogy bibliography; local and state resources; large genealogical libraries; and genealogical periodicals, to name but a few of the items included. A helpful reference work intended for librarians, but genealogists may find equally useful.

AMERICAN STATE PAPERS

During the time period of 1789 to 1837, over 1,500 documents were brought before congress. This valuable collection contains petitions or testimonies of over 80,000 individuals who filed claims with the federal government concerning property, compensation or services performed.

There are only 750 sets of the original series of the *American State Papers: Documents, Legislative and Executive of the Congress of the United States*, that were published by Gales and Seaton and printed in 1834. These documents are sometimes found in private or university libraries. A reprint of the first nine volumes of the *American State Papers* and the *Index (Grassroots of America: A Computerized Index to the American State Papers, Land Grants and Claims* edited by Phillip W. McMullin) was done in 1944 by Southern Historical Press, P.O. Box 1267, Greenville, S.C. For more information or to order copies contact Arkansas Research, P.O. Box 303, Conway, AR 72033.

WONDERFUL RESOURCE IN THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES OF CANADA (NAC)

For years there were rumors that a great hoard of genealogical material existed in Washington consisting of the records of the Tsarist Russian Consuls in Montreal, Halifax and Vancouver. It was known to have disappeared in 1917—the year of the Russian Revolution—and was thought to have been sent to Russian Consulates in the United States which did not recognize the government of the USSR until 1933.

In 1980, a NAC search team found the records in an underground vault in Washington. Although the official period covered by the documents in 1900-1922, many records in the collection date back to the 1850's and some back to the early 1800's. The collection relates to people who came from the area covered by the old Russian Empire before 1917. In modern ethnic terms they include: Jews, Ukrainians, Russians, Finns, Poles, Byelorussians, Lithuanians, Latvians, Estonians, Armenians, Doukhobors, Germans, (Mennonites), Georgians, Cossacks and several other minority groups.

Some idea of the extraordinary size and nature of the LiRaMa Collection can be gotten from a general list of its contents:

- 1) About 100,000 registration forms containing names, places and dates of birth, nationality, ethnic origin, religion, occupation, names and places of residence and next of kin, places and lengths of residence in Canada.
- 2) About 150,000 photographs.
- 3) Cancelled passports and other travel documents.
- 4) Birth Certificates, identity cards, war service records, affidavits, school records, estate records and wills. —>

PORTS OF ENTRY

Have you ever considered Canada to be a Port of Entry? It is included in the FHLC with other ship passenger lists. Many Scandinavian emigrants arriving here after 1892 came through Canada into the upper Mid-west. Check the FHLC for "Canadian Border Crossing Lists." It is a card file indexed by Soundex providing the name of the ship on which they traveled, when/where it came from and where it landed. From this index you may be able to get a copy of the original ship list from the Canadian archives.

WEB SITES TO CHECK OUT

<http://www.geocities.com/Heartland/5978/Emigration.html> (**1/2)

This is a very useful Web site. It links to over one hundred sites. Each of these links lead to helpful information about ships and passenger lists. The sites were created by archives, museums and historical societies, and others are personal Web pages. Each site has important lists that will help genealogists do their research without leaving the comfort of their homes. These lists cover all different ethnic groups, from various time periods. The home page, with the links, gives data about the site. For example, site number 120 is a Passenger List from Dublin to New York on April 5, 1803. This links to a personal Web page that was created by a genealogist. She had researched this particular voyage and put complete information for anyone else who could use it. This includes the names of all the passengers, their ages, occupations, where they traveled from, and the number of children that traveled with them. Other sites have more passenger lists, ship lists, port lists and other details relating to this topic. At this time, the page covers mostly European sources, and few from other places. As more people add links to it, more areas will be covered, which will help other genealogists. The site is fairly easy to use, all you have to do is scroll down the page to see if any of the passenger lists are of interest to you. This is a good place to check out—perhaps you will get lucky and not have to go anywhere to find out about your ancestors.

This easy-to-use site is sponsored by the Department of Veterans Affairs. Though it does not have any lists, it gives comprehensive information on locating veterans and how to obtain military records. The site tells you what information is needed in order to be answered, where to send your queries, which forms have to be

filled out, which records no longer exist, what you can expect to receive, how long it will take to receive the data, etc. One problem with obtaining military records is that they still have to be ordered through the mail. They do have a form online, but it cannot be sent through the Internet because the government needs your signature before they will process your request.

There is also a section on tombstones, what they look like for various time periods, their size, what was provided by the government and some historical information. There are some nice photographs to help you understand the physical descriptions.

This is one of the best Web sites I have seen for people who are doing Czech research. The site allows you to post your surname for free - the only requirement is that it must be about someone from the Czech Republic, either Bohemia, Moravia or related areas. There are many surnames already listed, and also villages where the surname is commonly found. These are accompanied contact information. This isn't all the site has though, it also includes Czech history, movies and even a "Genie Online for Dummies" section. A cultural area discusses all the traditions for Czech weddings and uses nice graphics. There is even a section where you can listen to Czech music! There is also a Czech bookstore, that sells books, CD's, atlases, magazines and more. Finally, there is an area that leads to tons of Czech links, on a variety of topics. If you are at all interested in Czech research—this is the place to go!
