It is a public record and may be viewed in person at the Wisconsin Historical Society, Division of Historic Preservation. Intricate cornice. Perhaps one of the oldest extant houses in Marshfield. Was the home of William Upham, Wisconsin governor from 1895-1897. Supposedly the first house in the community to have electricity and running water. Also listed on the State Register (1/18/2008) and the National Register (7/30/2008, #08000753) as contributing to the Upham House Historic District.
