426 S Central Avenue

Architectural Style: Utilitarian "20th century Commercial" Customodial Building

Built in 1920 as the Meiner Pell Automobile Co., this automobile services building had a capacity of 20 cars, for sale & repairs. It is the only 1st generation auto garage still on Central. Materials are brick & concrete. Original car bay entries were located in the 2 ground level side bays, with entry to business & apartment in the middle. The building form is simple. The stepped parapet roof line is capped with tile copings. The façade has a design jutting out in cream brick at the top, "1920" engraved below it. There are soldiered brick courses above & below windows, & 2 courses below



the bay windows, bricks are set length wise or with ends exposed. The 2nd story apartment's projecting wood bay windows are unusual for a utilitarian building.
