900 E 4th Street Architectural Style: Art Deco Marshfield Middle School

Built in 1939 as Marshfield Senior High, it was designed by Eschweiler & Eschweiler, Milwaukee. It is constructed of steel reinforced concrete & structural tile & brick. It includes low horizontal lines, flat roofs, & rows of pane & glass block windows. There are decorative metal panels between windows, metal trim around windows & doors, & terra cotta motif pieces. The entry has "Senior High School" engraved above, bay windows separated with metal panels, a pointed arch window, & the Observatory Tower atop (vertical



drum & lead-coated copper roof). The 3^{rd} level has horizontal bands set on a denticulated base encompassing the building, windows set within that pattern; end façade windows are 2 stories high. Excluding north & west additions, the school is intact.
