
Eckes and Eckes Hardware

The members of this firm, father and son, are early residents of this section, known and respected as able and conscientious business men. (Marshfield Times, August, 26, 1908)



The Eckes Hardware Store is the building on the far left of this picture. Notice the change of building materials used in the buildings. The Eckes Hardware building was built sometime after the Fire of 1887 and was built of brick (as mandated for all new buildings.) The Springborn building in the center of the photo was at the edge of the devastation and not destroyed by the fire.
