MARSHFIELD'S FIRST MEMORIAL DAY SERVICES

[Reprinted from the Marshfield News Herald, page 1, column 1, Saturday, May 20, 1916.]

"The Early History of Marshfield" gives an interesting account of the first Memorial services in this city on May 30, 1881, as follows:

"The first celebration of Memorial Day sounds amusing, but most pathetic, as there were no old soldiers buried here. A shaft was erected under the trees in a grove near the W.C.R.R. and decorated with flowers in memory of the departed comrades. The imaginary tombstone was made of wood, paragola style, and painted white. Doubtless children had it to play with afterwards—children who are now among our city fathers. Alas! Our beautiful cemetery has claimed many an old soldier since then who has answered the last call and on Memorial Day we decorate their graves with grateful tears for what they have done.

PORTAGE COUNTY CEMETERY LOCATOR ON-LINE

The Portage County Cemetery Locator can be found on-line at http://library.uwsp.edu/cemetery/

There are over 43,000 names located in 67 Portage County cemeteries. This is a joint project of the UW-Stevens Point University Archives, Portage County Public Library and the Stevens Point Area Genealogy Society. The database is an update and continuation of Wayne Allen and Alta Guyant's Index of the Cemeteries of Portage County, housed at the Portage County Public Library.

The Guyant index was completed in the mid-1970's. The Cemetery Locator Database was completed in mid-November, 1999. The earliest identifiable birth date in the Cemetery Locator is that of Mary Crane, 1771-1872, in the first Belmont (Kent) Cemetery.

This celebration took place just west of the Upham pond. The tombstone referred to was built of basswood boards by T. F. Vannedom of this city.

The first old soldier buried in this city was Wm. Armstrong of Company G, 7th Wisconsin Infantry, Iron Brigade. He was buried in the woods north of town a few years before the cemetery was staked out. The exact location of his grave is unknown but it is near the south end of the present cemetery."
