## Modern 507 W. Park Street

Modern architecture features linear elements. Lines are important in the design, and the physical elements of the building, such as beams, posts, windows, open or floating staircases are used to assist the creation of linear free flowing spaces, and emphasized the interconnection of "inside" and "outside." Architects embraced modern materials and construction techniques. This house features a flat roof, a semi-private main facade, and an interplay of rectilinear volumes. That interplay is reflected in the recessed 1st floor corner is reflected in the recessed 1st floor corner compared to the recessed 2nf floor corner opposite.

The home is historically known as the H. C. Wears House and was built in 1936.
