Ranch 1720 N. Apple Avenue

The ranch style was a part of the Modern family, originating in the 1930s. It emerged as one of the most popular American styles in the 1950s and 60s, with the rise of the automobile. Now mobile homebuyers could move to the suburbs into bigger homes on bigger lots. The style is characterized by its onestory, pitched-roof construction,



built-in garage, wood or brick exterior walls, sliding and picture windows, and sliding doors leading to patios. This house features a widow's peak eave in both gables and also diagonal siding in the gable ends. There is a deep eave in the entry and a peaked end of the brick facade that mimics the eave.
