Saltbox 600 S. Washington Ave.

This New England Colonial style got its name because the sharply sloping ear roof that resembles the boxes used for storing salt. The steep roofline often plunges from two and one-half stories in front to a single story in the rear. In Colonial times, the lower rear portion was often used as windbreak. These square or rectangular homes typically have a large



central chimney, large, double-hung windows many times with shutters, and are generally a wooden framed house. Exterior walls are made of clapboard or shingles.
