SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER MEETINGS

The September meeting of the Marshfield Area Genealogy Group will be on Thursday, September 26, 2002 at the Marshfield Public Library in the General Meeting Room. Our own Ken Wood will be sharing tips with us on "Writing Your Own Autobiography." In October, Jeff Lindow will be joining us and sharing his expertise on Native American research. Although genealogical research isn't his specialty, he will be able to share many ideas as to what kind of records are available and where to find them. In addition, Jeff will be sharing information about the latest at Powers Bluff and some of the interesting things their group has found.

Just a reminder that there is no meeting in November or December, but we'll be back at the library in January.

Our January meeting includes Paul Ptacek enlightening us with his research on the Czech Republic. Paul has spent quite a bit of time there and will be sharing many fascinating details about doing genealogical research over there. WGS/WSGS MERGER

The following is from the President's message in the WSGS newsletter, Vol. 49, #1:

"On April 21, 2002, the WGC board voted to merge with WSGS and the following date, the WSGS board voted to accept the merger. A committee is now working out the details. The two key provisions of the merger are: WGC will cease its independent existence and WSGS will be the sole statewide genealogical organization, and Gene-A-Rama will be continued as an annual two-day conference that moves around the state replacing one of the two WSGS seminars each year."

It is important to note that WGC, in its 15 years of existence, has had a very beneficial impact on genealogy in Wisconsin. Gene-A-Rama meant that quality genealogical education came to the whole state, and that more people learned the value of quality genealogical research. WGC also caused WSGS to wake up to its statewide responsibilities. WSGS is a much better organization because of WGC. The two societies have worked together on a number of projects in recent years and now the time has come for there to be a single statewide genealogical society again, a much better and much stronger one. This merger is WGC's culminating contribution to Wisconsin genealogy. All WGC members are encouraged to become active in WSGS. We can use your talents and enthusiasm.

HOW TO DATE OLD ENVELOPES

If you have old undated letters in your collection of family papers, do not discard the envelope in which they were mailed. The postage stamp, along with your estimate of the appropriate age of the writer, may help date the letter.

Prior to 1847, stamps were not used on letters carried by the U.S. Postal Service. Later, the first class postage rates, per ounce, as of the following dates were:

FINDING SHIP PASSENGER LISTS FOR GREAT LAKES ROUTES

Many immigrants were called "two-boat people" because they sailed first to Canada and then to the United States via the Great Lakes. They did this because it was cheaper to buy a ticket to Canada than to buy a ticket directly to the U.S. Also, there was a time when immigration rules and regulations prevented them from going directly to the United States, but allowed them to go to Canada instead.

To find records of these immigrants, you should search the passenger lists of ships that maintained routes on the Great Lakes. Some of these records are kept in the public libraries of large cities along the Great Lakes, such as Duluth, MN, and Chicago, IL. You can also find passenger lists and arrival lists in local newspapers from that time period.

REGISTRATION LIST [As recorded in the Marshfield News, October 20, 1904]

The following is a list of the legal voters of the city of Marshfield, Wisconsin, as given out by the boards of registration. If your name does not appear on this list you should appear before the board of Registration for your ward at its next regular meeting to be held November 1, 1904. The polling places of the wards will be in the city hall and in the following rooms: First ward - Treasurer's office, Second ward - Council Room, Third ward - City Clerk's office, Fourth ward - Firemen's Assembly room, Fifth ward - General Assembly room, Sixth ward - Municipal Judge's room.
