Spanish Eclectic 1009 W. 5th Street

Spanish-style architecture takes its cues from the missions of the early Spanish missionaries and includes details from the Moorish, Byzantine, Gothic, and Renaissance architectural styles. The houses usually have lowpitched tiled roofs, stucco walls, and rounded windows and doors. Other elements may include scalloped windows and balconies with elaborate



grillwork, decorative tiles around doorways and windows. This house features brick soldier courses above and below the windows, exposed rafters, an entry with a flared awning above the front door with a stone quoin surround.

The home is historically known as the Steve J. & Elizabeth Miller House and was built in 1933.
