St. Clair—Page Clothing Store

In 1941 Ed Starks, Bill and Bob St. Clair purchased the Gag Clothing Store at 242 South Central and opened St. Clair and Starks Mens Clothing.

In 1948 Ed Starks moved to Mason City, Iowa, to open a new store. Alfred Page moved to Marshfield in 1948 as managing partner. In 1952 the name was changed to St. Clair—Page and the store was remodeled—new furniture and doors. In 1960 a 30-foot addition, as well as new carpeting and fixtures were added.

In 1984 Page retired and Steve Johnson bought the store. St. Clair-Page always had top notch people on the sales floor, just to name a few—Bill Allen, Gene La Fond, Al Brock, Dan Burns and Don Marine (for 31 years) who still helps part-time. Anna Doll, the tailor, started in 1945 and spent 45 years in the store.
